What is the Writing Center?

The Writing Center provides free tutorial services to all Mason writers. Appointments are offered online in 45-minute synchronous or asynchronous formats. You can meet your tutor in real time on Zoom or submit your draft for your tutor's written feedback.

What should I expect?

We work with writers at every stage of the process:

Planning	Revising
Brainstorming	Editing
Drafting	Polishing

A tutor can help you develop, clarify, and organize your ideas as well as share strategies and techniques for writing and revising. You can expect to leave your session with some good feedback, concrete strategies you can use in future writing assignments, and a plan for further developing or revising your draft.

How do I make an appointment?

To register and make an appointment, go to the Writing Center's website: writingcenter.gmu.edu and follow the Register link. After registering, you can access the schedule online to make an appointment. Watch the video on the website's home page for a demonstration of how to register, log in to the scheduler, and make an appointment.
